

Chena River State Recreation Area

This framed cabin is located at campsite #1 within the Granite Tors Campground at mile 39.5 Chena Hot Springs Road. Amenities include a woodstove, small table, kitchen counter, bunk beds and a sleeping platform, and is wired for electricity. Guests will need to provide their own firewood and generator. The generator plug in requires a double male cord. Please help keep it neat and attractive for those who will use it after your visit.

Important Information

Let someone know where you are going and when you expect to return.

- Cabins may only be used by those who have paid the rental fee in advance, and only on the days specified on the
- receipt. You must have your receipt-permit with you during your stay.
- Cabins may not be used for commercial activities.

What to take to the Cabin:

- The cabin measures 12' X 20'. There is a partioned sleeping area with bunk beds and a twin sleeping platform. The cabin can sleep a maximum of 4 adults.
- The cabin is supplied with a wood stove, table, seats, broom, ax, saw, and ash scoop. All other camping equipment and supplies must be provided by the user, including:
 - Sleeping bag and pad or air mattress
 - Food
 - Cookware, dishes, utensils
 - Cooking stove and fuel
 - Matches, lighters, paper fire starter
 - First aid items
 - Plastic trash bags
 - Jug of water
 - Saw or ax, just in case
 - Firewood
 - Flashlight
 - Lantern and fuel
 - Generator

Public Use Cabin

A few necessary do's and don'ts:

- Do not leave food or garbage in the cabin at the end of your visit. It might seem helpful to share food with future cabin users, but food (even in airtight containers) attracts bears and small animals. It doesn't take them long to seriously damage a cabin. Please pack out everything you packed in.
- Do not leave cookware, sleeping pads, or other items in the cabin at the end of your visit.
- Please leave some cut dry wood for the next visitor. A bow saw and ax are provided for your use. Only DOWN trees may be cut. Firewood may not be removed from the premises or the recreation area.
- Keep the fire in the stove under control. Do not leave the dampers open when you are not in the cabin, as a fire could start and destroy the cabin. Close all dampers completely at the end of your visit.
- Please dispose of all waste water in the toilet. Water dumped outside the cabin is unsightly, unsanitary, and attracts unwanted wildlife. Do not place garbage in the toilet, please pack it out.
- Target practice is prohibited. The recreation area is closed to the discharge of weapons. See regulations for details.
- Stay alert and cautious of any trapping activity in the area.
 Traps and bait may be located near trails. Children and pets should be monitored closely.
- Please tie dog teams and horses at least 100' from the cabin. Do not tether animals to live trees. Use a cable or other anchor system which does not allow the animals to scar living vegetation.
- Feel free to write your comments in the cabin's logbook.
 Please report any missing or damaged furnishings or other problems to the State Parks office in Fairbanks immediately.

Check out time is 12:00 noon.

The Lock Combination is:

Dial the combination on the bottom of the lock, <u>push</u> the <u>lock together</u>, and then <u>pull it apart</u>. The numbers must all be lined up.

Granite Tors Public Use Cabin

The turn off for Granite Tors Campground is located at mile 39.5 Chena Hot Springs Road, approximately 50 miles northeast of Fairbanks. Turn left at the campground and trailhead. Follow the campground access road. The cabin will be located on the left hand side at campsite #1. The cabin provides great access to the Chena Hot Springs Winter Trail also known as the Yukon Quest Trail which passes the rock quarry just north of the cabin.
